





Unlike Uzbek families, traditional gender roles are less prominent, with a trend toward gender equality and shared responsibilities. In contrast, Uzbek families emphasize collective well-being, reflected in parenting styles that prioritize obedience and conformity. English families, on the other hand, place a greater emphasis on individualism and personal achievement.

While a considerable number of English families lean towards secularism or have loose religious affiliations, Uzbek culture heavily integrates religion, shaping family values through Islamic or other religious beliefs.
