# 3. Chunking

The next method is to read the text in small sections, known as chunking. If learners are reading a longer or more complex text, consider breaking it down into smaller parts. For example, they could read two paragraphs at a time, then pause and quickly summarize what they have just read in their mind. Chunking relieves them from excessive pressure and increases their ability to fully comprehend the information in the text.

# 4. Understanding from Context

Another strategy is understanding from context, which is an excellent way to comprehend what language learners are reading even if there are words they don't know. To understand from context, students should pay attention to the words and sentences surrounding the unknown words. For this, they focus on the main phrase or idea in the sentence and try to understand the general meaning of the paragraph based on that. They can also analyze the meaning of a word by looking for synonyms or antonyms located near the unknown word.

## 5. Summarizing

The final strategy is to summarize what learners have read. One of the most efficient strategies for achieving a deeper understanding of reading material is composing a summary. Writing a summary requires them to identify the important aspects of the text and express them in your own words. This process helps determine whether they have truly understood what they have read and makes it easier to remember the information for the long term.

Developing text comprehension is one of the most crucial aspects of the reading process. The strategies discussed in this article – such as summarizing, predicting, understanding from context, and chunking – help learners deeply comprehend the content of a text, solidify knowledge, and enhance critical thinking. Through these approaches, learners can significantly improve their ability to effectively read and understand even long and complex texts.
