

**IX-XII SOCIO-POLITICAL SITUATION IN CENTRAL ASIA, ASPECTS OF  
INSTITUTIONAL FORMATION OF THE FAMILY**

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**Abstract:** *This article discusses the establishment of the norm in the Republic of Uzbekistan that “The family is the basic unit of society and is under the protection of society and the state” indicates that the family is inextricably linked with society. If the family is healthy, then society is strong, and if society is strong, then peace, prosperity, and prosperity are stable in our country. Because it is highlighted that the family is a small manifestation of society.*

The socio-political processes that took place in Central Asia in the 9th-12th centuries led to the formation of the family institution and the strengthening of its legal, economic and social foundations. The family is a social group consisting of people connected by blood, kinship, cohabitation, and having rights and obligations arising in relation to each other. The strength of the family ensures the perpetuity of life and existence in society, children continue generations. The family also plays the role of a place that influences the kind of person children will become in the future, and educates them.

The laws and other regulatory legal acts adopted by our state are aimed at supporting families, raising children who are physically healthy and mentally mature, and providing assistance to low-income families. Society is interested in the peace, tranquility, and health of families and children. Society and the state protect the rights, honor, dignity, and honor of the family, and create the necessary conditions for the family. The family is protected not only by the state, but also at the international level.

The United Nations General Assembly has designated May 15 as the International Day of Families, and since May 15, 1994, International Family Day has been widely celebrated all over the world, including in Uzbekistan. In accordance with the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan “On measures to further intensify work on systematic support for families and women”, in order to popularize the life experiences of prosperous and stable families, the “Ibratli oila” badge was established, which is awarded to families that have made a worthy contribution to strengthening the family, preserving and developing family values, and the procedure for presenting it on May 15, International Family Day. The issue of the family has its own important features and is of

great importance in the life of society. A legislative system has been created in the Republic of Uzbekistan to regulate family legal relations.

The Constitution of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Family Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the normative legal acts adopted by the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan and relevant governing bodies regulate family legal relations in accordance with international norms. The chapter "Family, Children and Youth" of the Constitution of Uzbekistan establishes on a general basis that the family is under the protection of society and the state, that the state creates social, economic, legal and other conditions for the full development of the family, and that family members have rights and obligations. During the years of independence, our country, along with the implementation of large-scale reforms in this regard, has created a solid legal framework to support the institution of the family.

The Family Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan was adopted on April 30, 1998 and entered into force on September 1, 1998. It regulates family legal relations and establishes rules for strengthening family relations, ensuring that family relations are built on the basis of mutual love, trust and respect, solidarity, mutual assistance, determining the responsibilities of family members and protecting the rights of family members. A number of laws, resolutions of the Cabinet of Ministers, as well as presidential decrees and resolutions aimed at strengthening the institution of the family have been adopted. These include the Law "On State Youth Policy" (2016), the Law "On Guarantees of Equal Rights and Opportunities for Women and Men" (2019), and the Model Regulation "On Centers for the Rehabilitation and Adaptation of Women Victims of Violence and Suicide Prevention" (2018).

Family policy requires comprehensive support for the family institution, elimination of current problems facing the family institution, ways to improve family relations, and development of future development trends for the family institution. Today, there are such problems as the increase in the number of divorces, cases of violence against women, the need for comprehensive support for young families, and the lack of sufficient attention paid to raising children in some families. In order to comprehensively support family policy and family institutions, we need to pay attention to strengthening our family values, increasing the material well-being of families, and improving the family education system. In recent years, the benefits, material and moral support provided to families, women, large and low-income families, schoolchildren and students have played an important role in improving the family environment and raising a healthy generation. In particular, the Constitution of the Republic of Uzbekistan establishes such principles as marriage and family relations being based on national values, being established on the basis of the voluntary consent of a man and a woman, their equal rights, and the upbringing and care of children in the family.

Goal 70 of the New Uzbekistan Development Strategy for 2022-2026 sets out tasks such as supporting young families, and goal 71 sets out tasks such as ensuring the

continuity of family, educational institutions, and community education. Many laws and by-laws are being adopted to further increase the role and participation of the family in social development, and to strengthen state support for improving the legal, social, economic, spiritual and moral interests and well-being of families. For example, the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated March 7, 2022 set out measures to implement the following issues:

- protecting the rights and legitimate interests of women in the country;
- increasing the economic, social and political activity of women;
- preserving women's health;
- ensuring women's vocational training and employment;
- widely involving women in entrepreneurship;
- providing social support for women in need;
- ensuring gender equality.

All the conditions created in our country are aimed not only at supporting women, but also at protecting the interests of society and the state, and such qualities as respecting parents, being kind and caring to them, based on values passed down from generation to generation, are the obligation of every person. The protection of the interests of mothers and children is ensured by preserving the labor and health of women, creating conditions for women in the labor process, and providing material and moral support for motherhood and childhood. The state has provided benefits and social guarantees to families with many children in accordance with the legislation.

The Committee for Family and Women has developed an electronic system for working with the “Women's Book”. With the help of this system, an application from a woman in need of social protection to be included in the “Women's Book” is accepted and the results of considering this application are provided. Women included in the “Women's Book” are also registered. A family with four or more children under the age of eighteen is a large family. If one or more of the four or more children is studying in full-time education (secondary specialized and higher professional) educational institutions and is under the age of twenty-two, this family is also considered a large family. The state ensures that families with many children are provided with benefits and social guarantees in accordance with the legislation.

**Conclusion:** The family is a small form of society, and society is formed in the unity of the family. The role of the older generation and parents is great in the formation of a certain lifestyle in the family, the acquisition of life experience, and the development of children into moral and spiritual maturity. Because grandparents, who are representatives of the older generation, instill universal human values in the younger generation based on their teachings and advice, and make them perfect people for society. Family relations, the institution of the family are determined by the existing rules in society and change under their influence.

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
