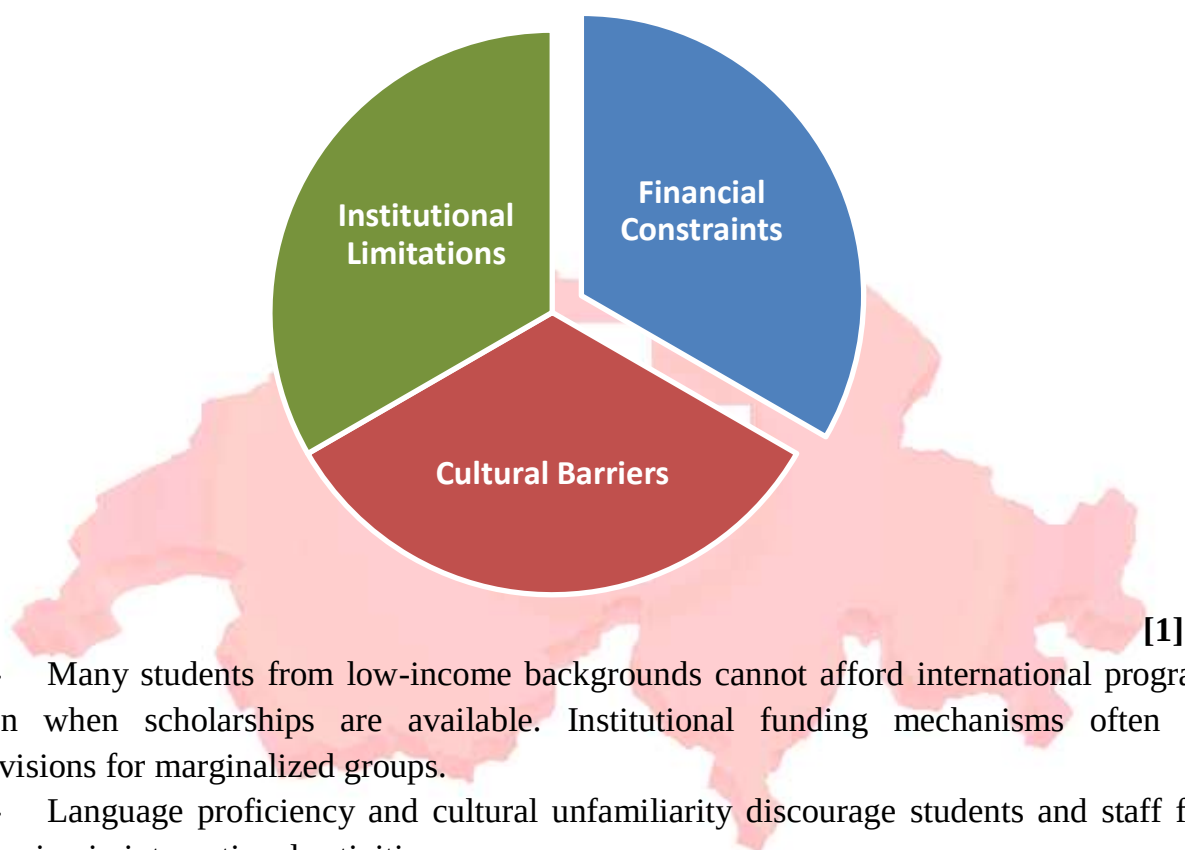

Scholars like Altbach and Knight (2007) emphasize that internationalization should not only prioritize academic excellence but also address disparities in access to global opportunities. In the context of Uzbekistan, internationalization is still evolving, with efforts often concentrated on partnerships and student mobility. However, marginalized groups, including low-income students and rural populations, remain underrepresented in these programs. This gap underscores the need for targeted policies and institutional frameworks to ensure that internationalization benefits all members of the academic community.

Diagram 1. Barriers to Equity and Inclusion for the Internationalization process of universities

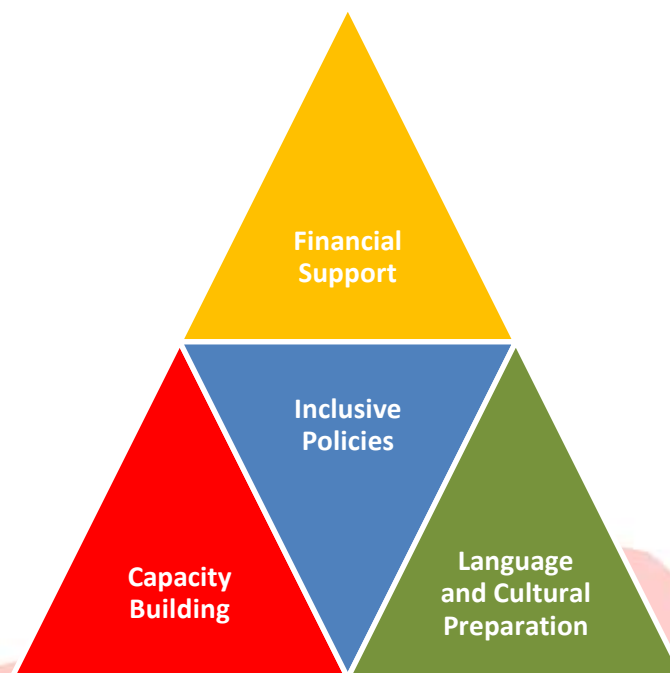

- Many students from low-income backgrounds cannot afford international programs, even when scholarships are available. Institutional funding mechanisms often lack provisions for marginalized groups.
- Language proficiency and cultural unfamiliarity discourage students and staff from engaging in international activities.
- Institutional Limitations: Limited staff training and awareness of equity issues hinder the development of inclusive internationalization policies.

Uzbek HEIs have made progress in internationalization through partnerships and exchange programs. However, policies explicitly addressing equity and inclusion remain scarce. Successful practices include targeted scholarships for underrepresented groups and cultural training sessions for participants in international programs.
