### **Introduction**

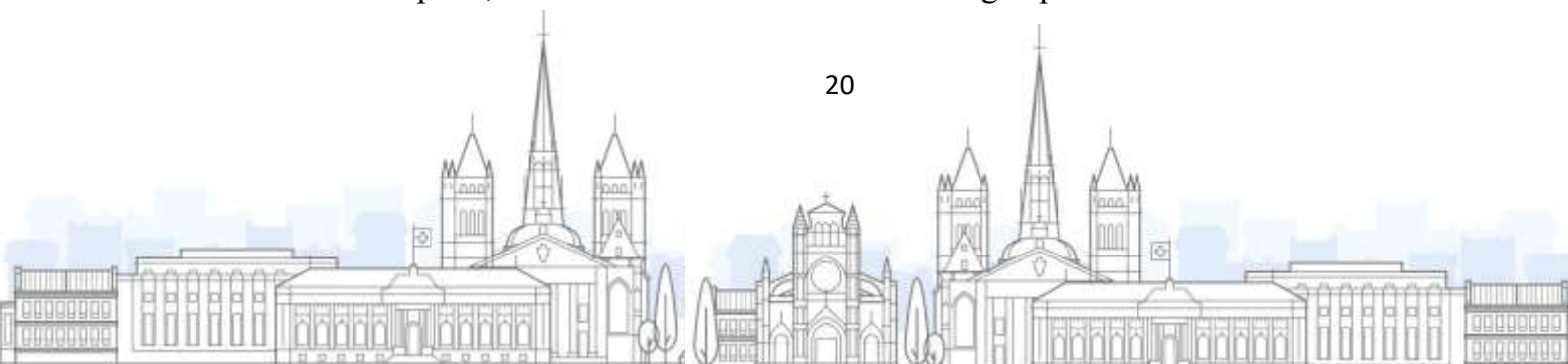
